Pinnacle's 1635 polypropylene as marketed by Pinnacle Polymers Company, in natural, uncolored pellet form complies with appropriate requirements of CFR Title 21, Part 177, Subpart B, Section 177.1520 (c) 1.1a, entitled "Olefin Polymers" of the Food Additives Amendment of 1958 to the United States Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act of 1938.

May be used in contact with food types I, II, IV-B, VII-B and VIII described in Table 1 of § 176.170(c), under conditions of use B through H described in table 2 of § 176.170(c) and with food types III, IV-A, V, VI, VII-A, and IX described in Table 1 of § 176.170(c) under conditions of use D through H described in table 2 of § 176.170(c).
